Commissioning Service weekend Dec 6/7th

There will be a commissioning service during mass to officially install all current and new Lectors (readers) and Extraordinary Ministers of Communion. Everyone who reads at mass or reads the Word of God at the hospital or seniors home must be present either Sat. Dec. 6 or Sunday Dec. 7th.

Anyone who gives Holy Communion at mass or has a pyx and brings Communion to a neighbour or family member must be present that weekend. If you have a pyx that you are no longer using, would you consider returning to the parish for others to use?

There will be two commissioning services either Saturday or Sunday during the weekend mass, so Lectors and Extraordinary Ministers of Communion can choose which installation service they wish to attend, but those who read or give Holy Communion must attend one, to be certified to give Holy Communion in the New Year.


