The Sacred Pause

As a Catholic priest serving in North Sydney, the past seven years I have accompanied more than 500 families during their mourning of a loved one. One remarkable aspect of this community that touches me deeply, is its shared tradition following funerals. As the hearse departs from the church and proceeds through town toward the cemetery, all vehicles pull over to the right and traffic halts. This collective gesture demonstrates the community's respect for the deceased and their families, irrespective of individual circumstances.

Recently, there were two notable tragedies with our US neighbours: the death of a Ukrainian immigrant on public transportation and an assassination involving a speaker at a university campus where open discussion is encouraged. I do not use social media, but I have received screenshots showing individuals, including some in Cape Breton, celebrating and justifying the violence.

It saddens me that there has been little public outcry over the death of an innocent girl just coming home from work, an act that once would have led to solidarity for vulnerable women, refugee or not.

In the other case, there is online outcry over the assassination, but the anger is not on the shooter, instead it is focused on the victim. Many are justifying the murder and some are celebrating the speaker's assassination during a public debate on a university campus.

As a university chaplain, education spaces were designed to seek truth in many fields, cultivate dialogue and foster the free exchange of ideas. How can students enter into the quest to learn if they are not safe to dialogue on a university campus?

Parishioners, students and friends have asked for my perspective, and I cannot write on mourning without first acknowledging the mourning in Gaza which is unending, and deepening. The Bible says, "there is a time for everything."

"There is a time for war and a time for peace"

"a time to weep and a time to laugh."

"a time to mourn and a time to dance.

"A time to speak and a time to keep silent".

- now is that time. Ecclesiastes 3: 1-11.

While not everyone accepts the authority of the Bible, its influence as the most published and read book in history lends a moral weight to guidance like; keeping silent during mourning. The disturbing online reaction is designed to silence, but in an inverted sense; the evil one twists timing and truth. Notice the craftiness, how the spirit of evil convinces good people not to be outraged at the assassin. Instead, the evil one whispers in our ear to redirect the outrage, even celebrate death, while disrupting the universally accepted time of family mourning.

All civilized states in the world practice a period of mourning according to their cultural and/or religious traditions. Even in the ancient world, there was a time of mourning. Healthy societies, out of respect, at least maintain silence, including social media, until after the funeral. I know good, holy, honest people who say they are against the death penalty but then justified this killing. Some even publicly maligned the deceased on social media, during the time of mourning, blaming them for unacceptable views. One Canadian teacher showed the execution to the class and explained why he deserved it. However, when a death occurs, regardless of who it is, we stop for a time and the friend or foe narrative is put on hold.

The evil one is so cunning and manipulates with language, emotion, the senses and other tactics. From a spiritual perspective, it is a sign of a dark culture when the death of another is relished and in one case celebrated. The person who does not respect the time of mourning only reveals a wound

within themselves. There will be a time to speak, and that is after the funerals. At death, civilized societies show respect for the deceased family members who are mourning. Even when we vigorously disagree with the deceased, at least during this sensitive time after death, where fellow human beings were murdered, we speak words of sympathy, but if we cannot we remain silent. "There is a time to speak and a time to keep silent". Ecc. 3:7

As a priest, who has celebrated funerals for all types of people, I can say all are treated like the children of God, they are. Remember, to God you will always be a beloved child. We extend this love to all grieving families. The people of North Sydney demonstrate a respect for all deceased by pulling to the side of the road as the deceased drives past in the hearse. Such a welcoming and non-judgmental gesture by the people.

I invite everyone to extend that spirit of respect to all forms of communications. Keep silent during the time of mourning until after the funerals are celebrated. Please invite your friends and family to take this time of mourning into reflection, which will unconditionally be given to all families. Hopefully after consideration, including prayer for some, we pause and we wait - for soon there will be a time to speak.
